Objective:

This course will teach basic trigonometric concepts including the application and properties of trigonometric, circular, and inverse functions.

Assignments:

You will be given an assignment after every lesson. These must be neat. The original problem should be written before computations begin. **ALL** work must be shown. Assignments will usually be due the next class day after the day it is assigned, but not all assignments will be collected for credit. I strongly suggest you do them **ALL** anyway. All assignments must be handed in on time. **NO CREDIT** will be given for late assignments. All assignments are posted in advance on the web at phsmath.org.

Quizzes:

You will be given a quiz over each lesson the day after it is presented. These quizzes cover what your chapter tests cover, so they are a great tool for you.

Tests:

There will be a test after every chapter. Some chapters will have more than one. You will also have 7 memory tests.

****You will need to bring your notebook daily to take notes. Pencils are required for all tests and quizzes, and recommended for homework.**

Supplies:

You are expected to bring the following supplies to class everyday.

Pencil, Calculator, Protractor with a ruler edge (chapter 5), Notebook and loose leaf paper, Graph Paper (optional for chapter 5), Textbook

Attendance:

Hall passes – You must have a hall pass with you anytime you leave the classroom which will be administered at the teachers' discretion. You must ask before using the pass.

Assignments – If it is assigned before the absence, it is due the day you return. If you are gone multiple days, you have those days plus one to get your assignments turned in. CHECK THE WEB!

Tests/Quizzes – If you are absent for a test/quiz, you have one week to make it up. If it is a planned absence, you must make plans to take the test/quiz before you leave.

Unexcused Absences – **NO CREDIT** will be given if you are unexcused. This includes tests!

Tardies – You are expected to be here on time. The Ponderosa tardy policy will be enforced if you are late to class.

Behavior Expectations:

- Follow PHS Behavior Norms
- Students will not be allowed out of class during the first or last 10 minutes of class. Students must have teacher permission and the hall pass any time they leave the class.
- Students are expected to remain in class until the passing bell and will be dismissed by the teacher.
- The PHS tardy policy will be enforced.
- The PHS dress code will be enforced.
- Food and drink (except water) will not be allowed in the classroom. Passes are not issued to visit vending machines during class time.
- Electronic devices are not to be used in class without specific permission from the teacher. MP3 players may be listened to when you are working individually in class, but not during tests. If they become a distraction they will be taken. Cell phones and calculators are not to be used to play games in the classroom at any time. Cell phones are to be turned off and not used during class or they will be taken and turned into administration.
- Be attentive and courteous to each other as well as the teacher
- Do not disrupt the learning of others
- **If caught cheating, the work will be worth zero points and student may receive an office referral. Cheating a second time could result in failure of the course.**
- **Not following Behavior Expectations will result in classroom consequences or an office referral.**
